Calling All Students and Job Seekers

Kindled Spirit is an anti-human trafficking charity that raises awareness of this crime against humanity and raises funds to support the young female survivors in India. We partner with a small charity, Kshamata, based in the city of Mumbai. Kshamata undertakes much needed work to support rescued girls, through counselling, life skills / vocational training and ultimately leading to career options and self-sufficiency.

Kindled Spirit is proud to launch its new mPower Project. The initiative is aimed at students seeking a place at university or people seeking a new apprenticeship or job role. It is clear that universities, employers and society look favourably on people who contribute some of their time to help others. By supporting the mPower Project; contributors will be able to include us in their Personal Statement or CV which will help their application stand out from the crowd.

The Problem

Human trafficking, or modern-day slavery, is an abhorrent crime that affects over 50 million people and 160 countries across the globe - 50% of these are children.

Human trafficking is second only to the international drugs trade in terms of criminal profitability. The sale of human beings generates \$100bn per annum for organised crime

groups, more than the combined profits of Microsoft, Intel, Google, Nike and Starbucks.

Most trafficked girls are between the ages of 9 and 14, tragically 80% of these end up in the commercial sex industry.

The Situation in India

According to the Global Slavery Index 2018, more than 8 million people are entrapped in slavery in India today. Slavery is illegal in India, but due to the complex social infrastructure, continues on an industrial scale.

It is estimated that up to 100,000 girls are trafficked in India each year, either from within the country or from Nepal, Myanmar or Bangladesh.

Children tend to be trafficked into the commercial sex industry, forced marriages, or brick kilns / factories.

Charities and government officials in India work hard to combat the traffickers, but due to the sheer scale of the problem, the government care homes are often full. The girls cannot find work so they fall back into the hands of the traffickers and the cycle of abuse repeats.

This is where we come in.

Their stories illustrate the reason why Kindled Spirit and Kshamata 'do what we do' and give these vulnerable girls a new start in life by enabling a fulfilling and meaningful existence, read on

Priya's story

I was trafficked and sold by my brother-in-law when I was very young. I ended up in a brothel in Bhivandi red light area. I begged for help but in vain. Gradually, I submitted to it as I had no hope of escaping. Some years later, I was rescued in a police raid and placed in Shanti Sadan Rehabilitation Home.

Kshamata gave me counselling and helped me overcome my anger issues, brought about by my treatment in the brothel. They also taught me how to sew and found me some tailoring work, which I loved. I decided I wanted to become a professional tailor, so Kshamata raised enough money for me to buy my own sewing machine. Now I earn my own living altering clothes. Kshamata provided the supportive environment I never had when I was younger. They have allowed me to build a life for myself that I could only dream of a few years ago.

Priti's story

After being trafficked and rescued I was left with no confidence and very low self-esteem. Kshamata helped me talk through my terrible experiences. Initially I struggled with how to live the rest of my life. Kshamata gave me training in a range of skills so I could decide what to do next. I chose to study fashion and eventually became a professional fashion designer. Last year, having designed an outfit for a model (she told me it was beautiful), I had the confidence to walk the catwalk with her.

I saw Kshamata helping other girls in my position, and decided I wanted to give something back. I devoted my time, skill and energy to helping women with a past similar to mine. I have now trained over 150 women in sewing, baking and fashion design.

I can't thank Kshamata enough for giving me a bright and dignified future.

Asha's story

After being rescued from traffickers, I was placed in the Bhivandi Observation Home and joined the life skills and literacy training program run by Kshamata. I also completed basic training in sewing skills. At this time, I was very quiet and shy. I turned 18 in January 2019 and was referred to Kshamata's Residential Training Centre. I felt I had come to a different world where I could be myself. I've made good friends here and I'm no longer shy!

I learned English and studied Maths and other subjects. As part of my training I attended exhibitions and events, which I really enjoyed. I loved meeting new people and hosting visitors at the Training Centre, so Kshamata enrolled me on a Hotel Management course. I've now got a work placement in a 5-star hotel in Mumbai. I'm enjoying every moment and can see a positive and bright future for myself.
