## It's not a sprint,

## it's a sponsored MARATHON, supporting the Enterprise 100 project for Kindled Spirit.

The project centres on the expansion of the social enterprise initiative, currently run bu Kshamata at their residential centre in Mumbai, by moving into new premises and upscaling production capacity. The project will enable:

"Helping to give someone a chance in life for Kindled Spirit because of the opportunities that have been afforded to me" said Ian Hucker, who plans to run the Brighton Marathon on 10th September in aid of Kindled Spirit.

As you may have seen in the last newsletter, Kindled Spirit is jointly fundraising with our partner Kshamata for the Enterprise 100 project. The project centres on the expansion of the social enterprise initiative, currently run by Kshamata at their residential centre in Mumbai, by moving into new premises and upscaling production capacity. The project will enable:

- 1. Circa 100 young women each year to be trained in fulfilling work ready for the external job market
- 2. Kshamata to become financially self-sufficient
- 3. Much needed additional space to be available within the existing residential centre.

The social enterprise scheme is known as Kshamata Unlimited. It is an integral part of the comprehensive support and rehabilitation programme run by Kshamata. Another important aspect of the enterprise is providing a safe

environment where the girls can be given 'job readiness' training including time management, commitment / delivering to deadlines, team work and work place behavioural discipline. In addition, it also provides long-term employment in a safe environment for some women who might struggle in the external job market - all the women benefit from the 'earn-andlearn' approach. Kshamata Unlimited is recognised as a provider of quality products and therefore there is a ready market for their items, successful sales to date have demonstrated that.

Newly appointed Trustee Chris Wright stated, "this is a wonderful thing that Ian is doing for us, but more importantly for the young women that we support. Having recently undertaken a 39 mile hike for charity myself, I am fully aware of the dedication to training that this type of challenge takes, we are truly grateful for Ian's efforts".

Chris went onto say "we hope that many sponsors will get behind Ian and reward him for his hard work, he has setup a fundraising page on Just Giving, you will find the link later in the newsletter".


### **Editor Note**

Pradnya was trafficked to Mumbai against her will. She was rescued 18 months later and referred to the charity. In the early days she was angry, confused, suffering from malnutrition with nowhere to go. She undertook the residential rehabilitation programme, where it was identified she had a creative streak. As she progressed, her health, confidence and self-esteem improved.

Today she is a bright, confident young lady, who has learned to speak English and computer skills, providing more, well paid options in the job market. She shares independent accommodation with other girls and has trained in social media, an achievement unthinkable just a few years ago. Pradnya defines the charity's good work, this wonderful

story has been replicated many times since 2014, with young women entering the workplace in a variety of chosen disciplines, enjoying independent living and a fulfilling, selfsufficient life.

Ian said "as the opening sentence of this article states, I want to give these vulnerable young women a second chance in life, their back stories are horrific, they really deserve another go at life, the Enterprise 100 project will provide that opportunity to hundreds of vulnerable young women over the vears"

Ian further commented "Some would say that I have left it a little late in life to run my second marathon. It will be tough for sure, but I am privileged to have the opportunity to help change a life and to provide the foundation for someone, way less fortunate than me, the chance to climb out of abuse and poverty and have the chance to fulfil their own potential. In addition to that, competing the marathon in my home town of Brighton, fulfils a personal ambition for me. I hope you are able to 'dig deep' and support my challenge".

At the age of 12 Ishaan's parents took him on a trip to India, to the state of Gujarat, from where Ishaan's family originated. Little did Ishaan know how this journey would have a profound effect on him and help shape the person he is today. His parents took him to a slum where he met many children less fortunate than himself, however his observation was striking, never before had he seen such content children, a far cry from the everdemanding western society. Early in June we interviewed Ishaan to understand the full story behind the holiday, what drove him to set-up his own anti-slavery platform - Stolen Dreams UK and how this has led to a worldwide movement of youth activists holding politicians, authorities and stakeholders to account in terms of combatting modern-day slavery.
